BETTER OFF WORKING FULL TIME



Most people with learning disabilities will get more money in a full time job than if they do not work.

Those who work 16 hours or more a week are said to be working **full time**.

People will have more money in a full time job because they will normally get **National Minimum Wage, Working Tax Credit** and **Return to Work Credit**.



National Minimum Wage is the lowest wage that you should be paid.

Working Tax Credit is payment from the Government for people who are paid low wages.

Return to Work Credit is money given to help you get into work.



It is always important to get support and advice about your benefits to make sure that you will be better off.
